Once upon a time, there lived a girl who loved to play with yarn. Her name was Ann.

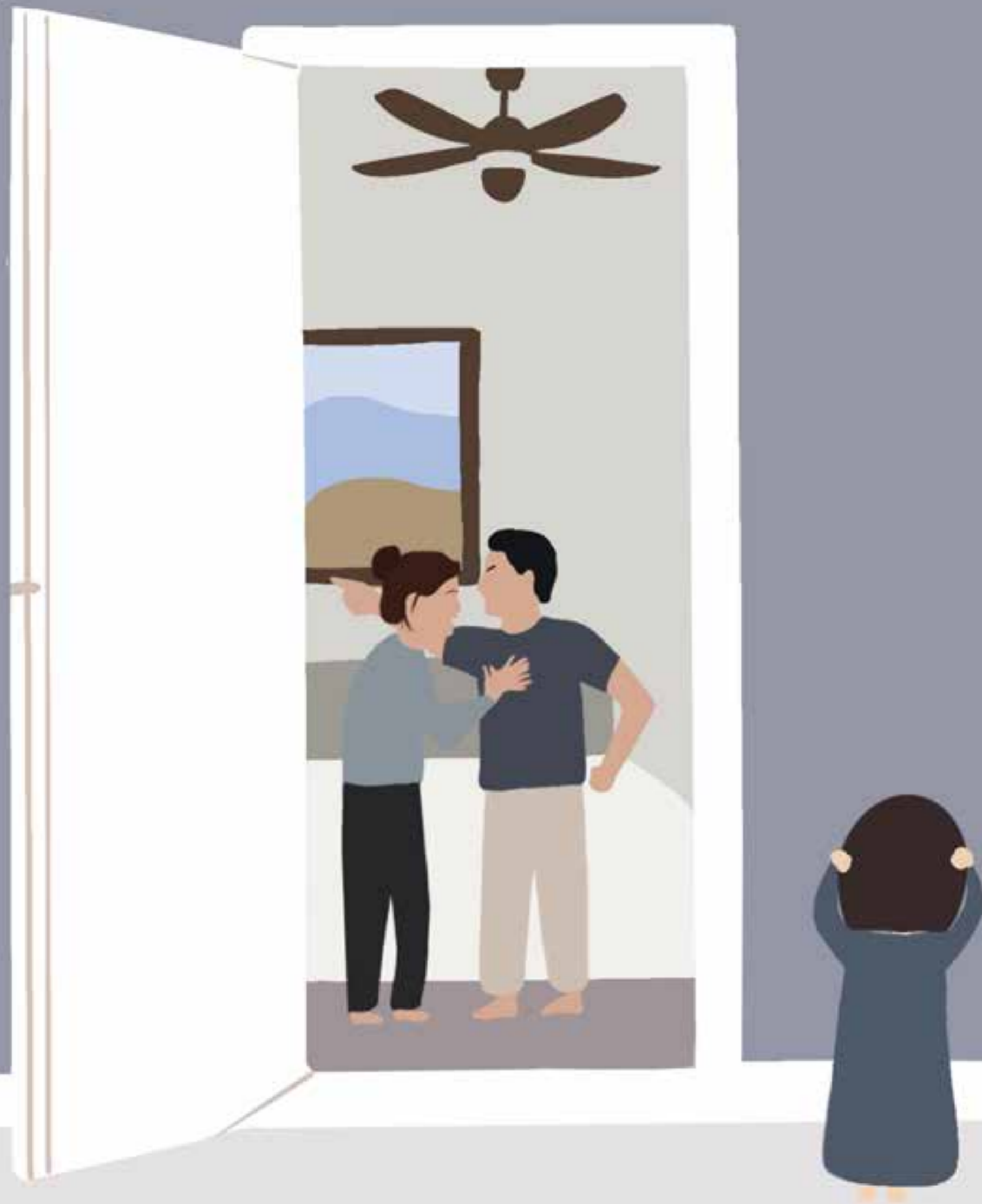


Ann's parents were very proud of her talent in making artworks using yarn.

"Who is going to take care of me? Will I be with mummy or daddy?"

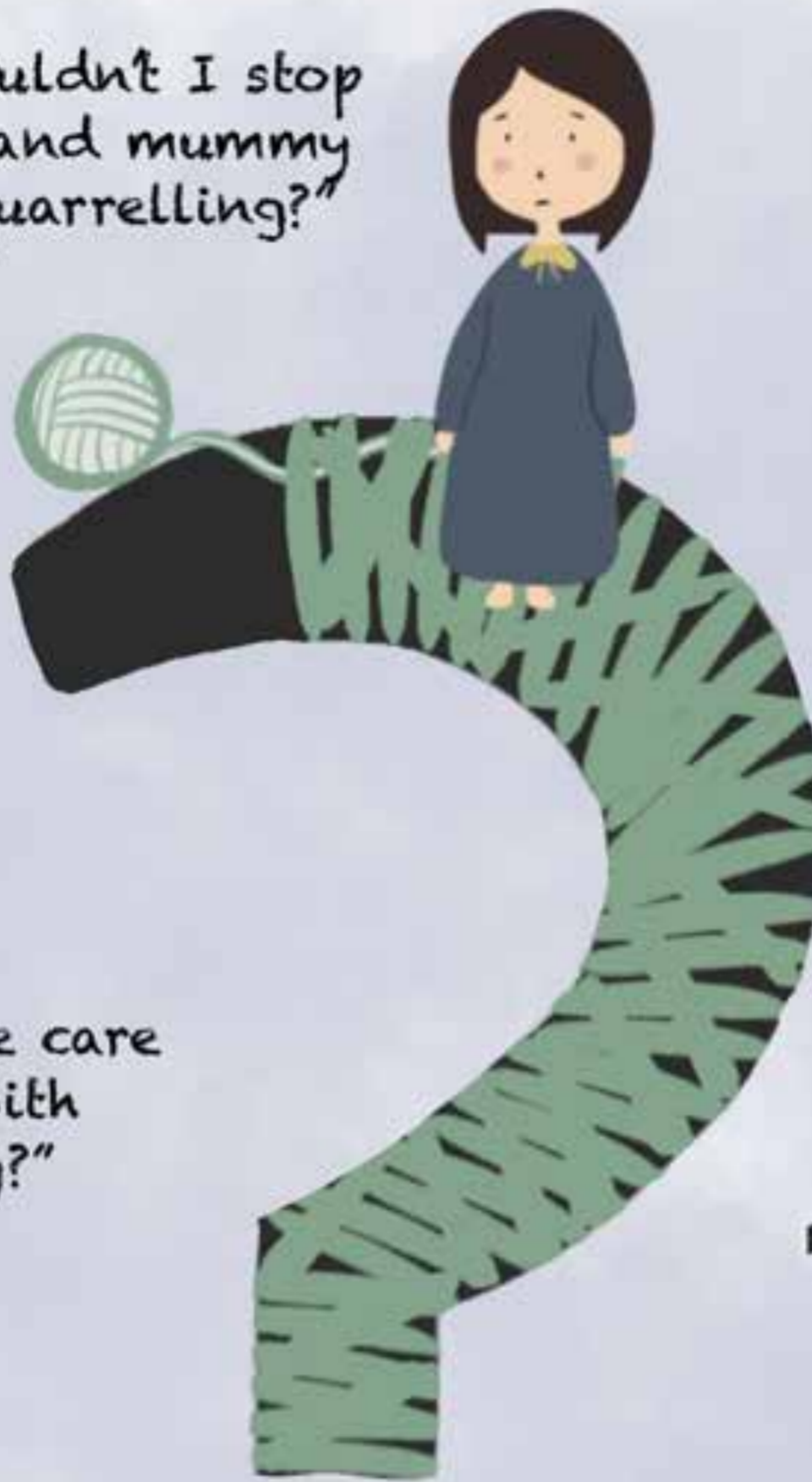

"It's my fault... I should have behaved better."

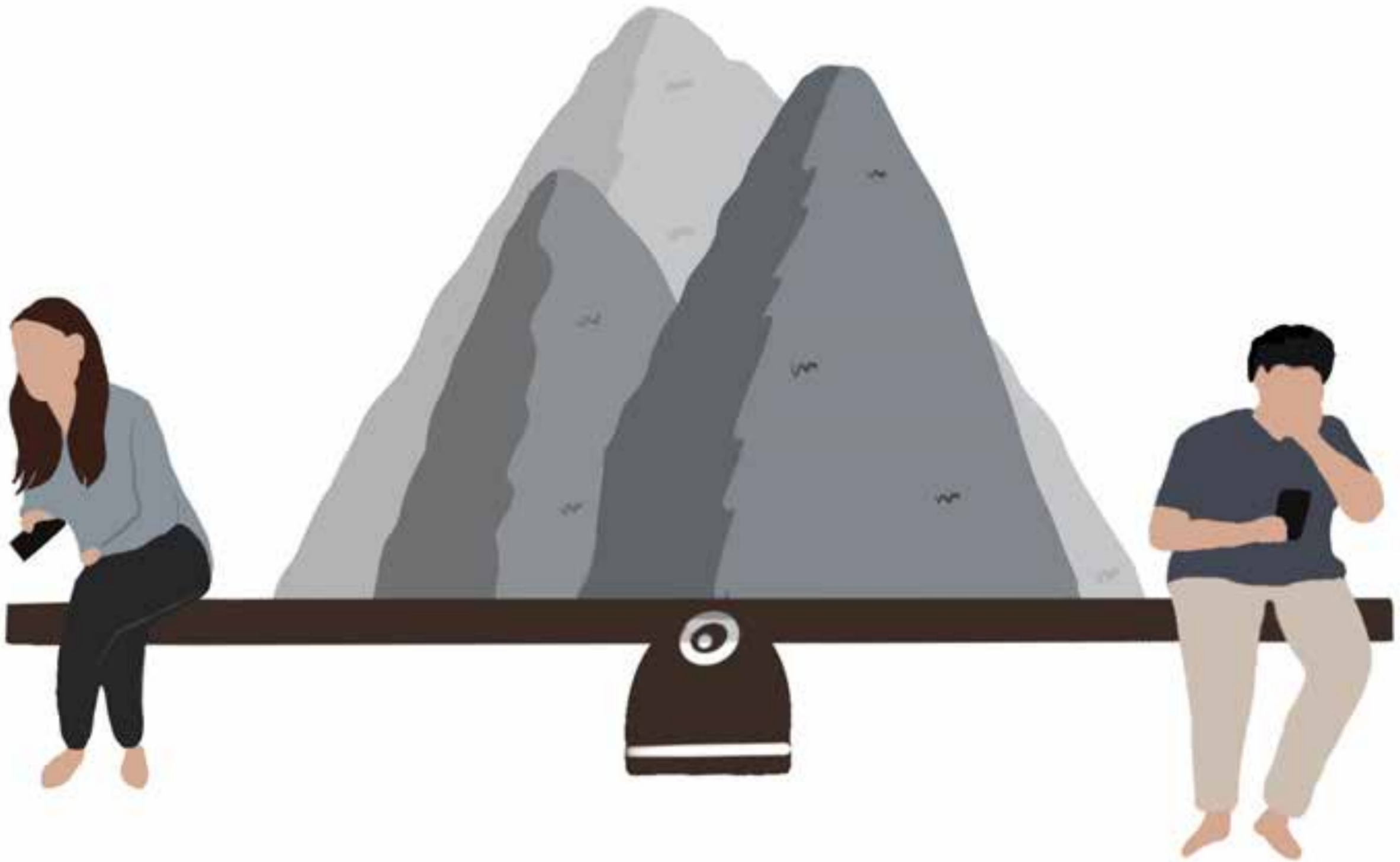
